1. afraid, alike, awake, aware: 叙述用法しかもたない形容詞を修飾

2. much [very] like, much [very] different, much too, much the same

He is much like his father. / Japan is much different from what it was before the war.

A computer virus is much the same as human virus. / The patient's condition is much the same.
